

Finding God in All Things

The concluding exercise from The Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius is called “The Contemplation to Love as God Loves.” St. Ignatius makes two preliminary comments in this exercise. First, love consists more in actions than words. Second, love consists in mutuality—a sharing of gifts between the one loving and the one loved.

St. Paul, in his letter to the Christians at Corinth, describes the many ways that love is expressed. He concludes this description with these challenging remarks:

If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels,
but do not have love,
I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal.
If I have prophetic powers,
and understand all mysteries and all knowledge,
and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains,
but do not have love, I am nothing.
If I give away all my possessions,
and if I hand over my body so that I may boast,
but do not have love, I gain nothing.


The Final Exam in Catholic Faith 101 consists of one question—“Did you love?” The answer requires supporting evidence.

Fr. Pedro Arrupe, a Spanish Basque who ministered to the victims of the atomic bombing of Hiroshima during World War II, was elected the 28th General of the Society of Jesus. In 1981 he suffered a massive stroke. For ten years he lived, prayed and gave silent witness to the power of love. He died in 1991. The following prayer is attributed to him.

Nothing is more practical than finding God, that is, than falling in a love in a absolute, final way. What you are in love with, what seizes your imagination will affect everything. It will decide what will get you out of bed in the mornings, what you will do with your evenings, how you spend your weekends, what you read, who you know, what breaks your heart, and what amazes you with joy and gratitude. Fall in love, stay in love, and it will decide everything.

You might call St. Ignatius Parish School a “School of Love.” We teach mathematics and English and science. Our students explore geography and computers and history. They learn Spanish. They discover the artist or dramatist or musician hiding within them. They excel at sports. They learn to balance the development of body, mind and spirit. But foundational to any of these other disciplines or skills is “growing in the ability to love.” In this respect, they learn the many faces of love—compassion, forgiveness, respect, kindness, peacemaking and service to those most in need.

While sending your son or daughter to St. Ignatius Parish School is clearly an investment, the results (as the old Master Card Ad proclaims) are priceless!

PRIESTS IN THE CLASSROOM: *A ministry of presence*



At St. Ignatius Parish School, religion is the foundation of our educational program and Catholic values are infused into all daily lessons. Our Catholic faith is central to everything we do at St. Ignatius Parish School. It permeates our hallways, classrooms, after-school activities and even our playground and social activities. Each school week begins with a school-wide prayer at the Monday morning assembly. Our children say prayers several times every day, attend Mass with their class once a week and each class participates in a special school liturgy attended by all of the students and members of the parent community.

As part of this spiritual development, our parish priests began visiting classrooms last year to lead discussions about our faith and spiritual journeys. During the visits, priests bring their faith journeys, their vocations, and their personalities to life for the children.

Whether it was Father Tom, Mike, Art, Jerry or Phil visiting their respective classes throughout the school year, they all focused on connecting with the students outside of the church. They would talk about saints, the sacraments or church, liturgical seasons like Advent, Lent and Easter. But they would also talk about issues of the day, sports, or what they had for breakfast. Students could ask the priests anything.

Father Jerry visited the 3rd and 6th grade classes during the year. He would play Jesuit Jeopardy with the students and answer tough questions like “How much money do you make?”

For the students, it is an opportunity to experience the priests in a non-traditional setting. Sort of like when they see one of their teachers at the grocery store for the first time.

“It is a way for us to not only reinforce our Catholic values in the classroom and the school’s relationship with the Parish, but to also give the students the opportunity to see the priests outside of the church, not in their normal setting at Mass giving the homily or communion,” said Patty Lane.

Father Art visited the 4th and 7th grade classes throughout the school year. “I took away from this experience a deeper appreciation for the work being done to provide a religious education for the students. I hope the students came away with a deeper awareness of the connection between religious education, liturgy and living out religious values in their daily lives.”

The ministries involvement in the classroom helped show students, young and old, that priests are accessible and they are human. Given the many demands on our ministry, we appreciate the time, attention and wisdom that our priests provide to our future leaders.

Magis Club: HELPING ST. IGNATIUS STUDENTS LIVE GREATER



Magis is alive and well at St. Ignatius Parish School. Under the leadership of school principal Patty Lane and our 3rd grade teacher, Katie Flores, a *Magis Club* was created offering daily opportunities for our children to live their faith in word and action.

Magis is a Latin term for “more” that was adopted by St. Ignatius of Loyola and suggests the spirit of generous excellence in which ministry should be carried on. Living the *magis* calls us to examine how our choices affect others and guides us to make decisions that benefit the greater good. At St. Ignatius Parish School we use *magis* to challenge our students to see God through others by serving individuals in the community to better their lives or their environment.

The *Magis Club* aims to be contemplative in action by meeting the needs of our school community as well as the Sacramento region through faith in action service projects. It is primarily a hands-on Christian service club that shows that children, too, can set the world on fire with their commitment to service opportunities in the local region and beyond.

A 7 year winning streak



The St. Ignatius Academic Decathlon Team has won the Sacramento Diocese Junior High Academic Decathlon for the 7th year in a row!

They placed 1st in Super Quiz with an unprecedented 48 out of 50 questions correct. They also took 1st place in the Logic portion of the competition. Even more impressive is that every team member placed in their individual subject. This has never happened at a Diocese competition.

The Academic Junior Academic Decathlon is a competition for students in grades 6-8. There are ten events. Two are collaborative team efforts – a logic quiz with 20 rigorous thinking problems, and a super quiz with 50 multiple choice questions on five broad academic themes. The remaining eight events test individual knowledge of the Roman Catholic doctrine, English, Literature, Science, Mathematics, Current Events, Social Studies, and Fine Arts. Awards are given for individual and team performance, and the winning school team from each geographic diocese competes in a state championship.

The team went on to compete at the State competition held at Aquinas High School in San Bernardino. This year's state competition was intense with only 600 points out of a possible 24,000 separating 1st from 2nd place. The team took 1st place in Super Quiz and 2nd place overall in the state of California.

Living the magis

St. Ignatius Parish School is committed to developing students of faith, action, integrity, thought, and health. Grounded in the Ignatian spiritual tradition that integrates the shared faith and values into the life and culture of the community, St. Ignatius Parish School provides a comprehensive Catholic educational experience for all its families, as well as the foundation for our boys and girls to go on and achieve things they never thought imaginable and be men and women for others.

One shining example of this is St. Ignatius alumnus Captain Lauren (Merchant) Hamlin, who recently took command of the Wounded Warrior-Transition Brigade at Bethesda Army Hospital in Maryland. The Brigade receives all wounded soldiers assigned to the hospital and provides medical management assistance to them as they navigate the Army's medical treatment system to successfully reintegrate back into the force or transition from the Army.

"My early faith-based education helped lay the foundation for my day-to-day decision making in my current position leading the Warrior Transition Brigade. Having a strong foundation that pushed morals, values and putting others first has definitely helped shape who I am today."

Lauren's new position comes on the heels of her assignment at the Pentagon, where she was presented with the Army's 2013 Pace Award from the Undersecretary of the Army -- Brad R. Carson. Lauren received the award for developing and implementing cost-saving strategies on multiple contracts that saved the Army more than \$14 million.



Lauren attended St. Ignatius and was a member of the class of 1998. She graduated from Loretto High School (Class of 2002) and was accepted into The Citadel Military College in South Carolina where she played soccer and graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Biology (Class of 2006). Up until that date, only 130 women had graduated from The Citadel. In 2009, Lauren received a Master Degree in Hospital Administration from the University of Maryland. She went on to serve a 15-month tour in Iraq before being assigned to the Pentagon.

Lauren's mother, Diane Merchant, is Director of Operations for the Parish. And her brother, Ryan, attended SI (Class of 1995). Along with her dad Eric, Lauren's family couldn't be more proud of her accomplishments.

"We are convinced that the sound academic and values-based education that Lauren obtained at St. Ignatius School and Loretto High School prepared her well for the challenges that she has experienced as an Army officer. We are so proud of the woman that she has become and everything she has accomplished along the way," said mom Diane.

Lauren currently lives in Alexandria, Virginia with her husband, David, and their daughter, Riley.

"I am thankful for my early education at St. Ignatius, but most importantly that my parents were willing to sacrifice in order for my brother and I to attend private schools. I would not be where I am today without their support and willingness to put our needs above their own."
