

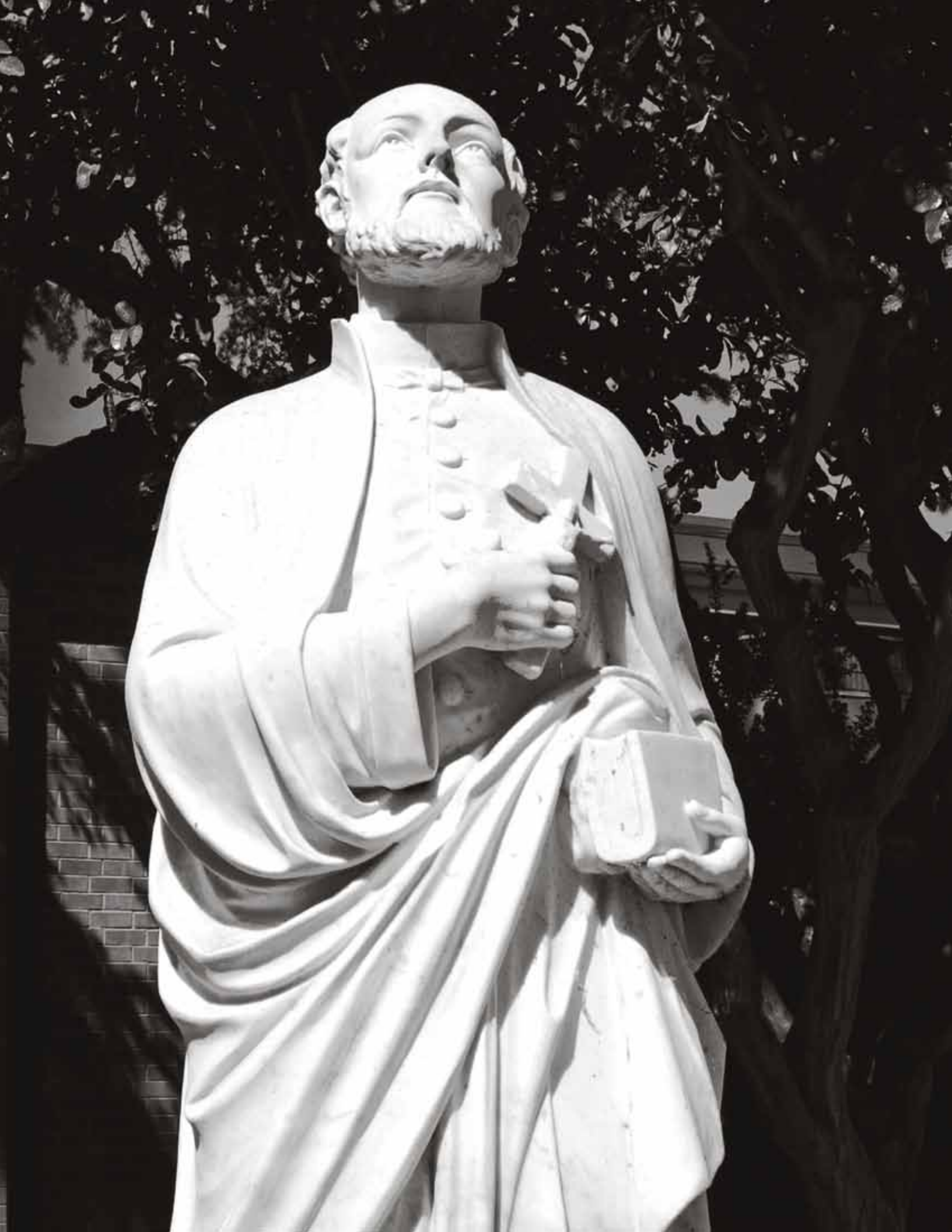

but is full of His blessing.
There is no life in the sea,
there is no creature in the river,

but proclaims His goodness.
There is no bird on the wing,
there is no star in the sky,

IN LOVING MEMORY: THE MOORE FAMILY BESTOWS GENEROUS GIFT

Harry and Kathleen Moore first set their eyes on Sacramento after World War II. It didn't take them long to settle down in California's capitol city. In 1949, they moved to Arden Park to raise their family, three daughters and a son. And the rest, as they say, is history.

The Moores were among, what have lovingly been deemed, the "barn" families. They were founding members of St. Ignatius and watched as the church took up its permanent location on Arden Way. The school opened its doors in 1954, and with that, came Harry and Kathleen's commitment to education.

"All of us kids attended St. Ignatius," says son John (Class of 1966). His sisters Mary (1959); Sandy (1960); and, Christine (1963) and two of three grandchildren were also SI Tigers.

From the start, the Moore family made their affection for the school known. Harry had a background in welding. He and his buddy, Marty Hansen, took one look at the school's playground and decided the children needed a place to play basketball. Together, the two friends built the school's first basketball standards. They were primer red, with oversized backboards and a distinctive "gong" sound that could be heard right outside of the first grade classroom.

Over the years, the Moores were involved in a variety of school and parish activities ranging from coaching sports to working as Parent Club volunteers and even driving on field trips.

Sadly, after 63 years of marriage, Kathleen passed away in 2008. Harry joined her side in heaven in 2011.

"When my parents passed, I received so many letters from graduates thanking me for the mentoring and leadership that they had imparted," explains

John. "Honestly, my parents relished the people they met at the parish and school."

The parents and classmates of their children became lifelong friends of the Moore family. They were proud to be part of the St. Ignatius community and a closely knit circle of friends.

"My parents realized that St. Ignatius needed a plan to continue to provide a cutting edge educational environment. They always considered the children to be the most valuable part of the school and church."

To ensure that their passion for their faith and, in particular, Catholic education in Sacramento would be sustained and grow for future generations, the Moore family remembered St. Ignatius School in their trust. The school recently became a benefactor of a gift exceeding \$600,000.

"The Moore family gift has been truly overwhelming," says Principal Patty Lane. "It is the single, largest gift ever received by our school. We are so honored and blessed that the Moores would think about the future of our school and its students, and we will respect their wishes to use these funds in the loving manner in which they were shared."

The school will move carefully in determining the long-term use of the gift. It is hoped that the money may lead to school improvements and possibly new structures.

"Whether the commitment is to a science building or a new school structure, my parents have given a gift and asked that the school endure in teaching the future leaders of our community and other communities," says John.

St. Ignatius Parish School is eternally grateful for the service shared by the Moore family for more than 50 years. Through this most gracious gift, their legacy and love for Catholic education will continue for generations to come.

BELOVED MRS. MACDONALD RETIRES

When third grade teacher Carla MacDonald made the decision to retire, she began thinking about all of the things she would miss. She had shared her passion for education with the St. Ignatius community for 26 years. As she began to reflect upon the nearly three decades, she did what all great teachers tell their students to do... she put her thoughts in writing.

Among her dozens of reflections entitled, Things I'll Miss: "Being with a student daily for one year and getting to see what kind of adult they turn out to be; meeting a new set of parents each year; getting good advice and support; and, teaching those insanely squeaky recorders every year."

Carla began her career at St. Ignatius teaching part-time for the seventh and eighth grades. She then taught third grade half-time while raising her family. When her youngest son went off to college, she became the full-time third grade teacher. Over the years, Mrs. MacDonald served as the faculty advisor to the Advisory Council, Parent Club, and worked with Student Council for 10 years to keep in touch with her students as they grew older.

"I think third grade is the perfect age," says Carla. "It's the 'universal' grade, when all children across generations are taught cursive and their multiplication tables. It's that time when solid memories are formed. I remember myself, from my own childhood, what my third grade classroom looked like."

Through the years, Carla has witnessed the transformation of the school from one where all of the teaching was done in one classroom to the learning environment where today students have individual instructors for science, computers, Spanish, and art. She hasn't forgotten the early years in her teaching career when she walked her students down to the library, but there was no school librarian. She remembers when the new principal, Patty Lane, decided that children needed to share their faith experience by attending Mass each week. She cheered the SI Tigers as they developed their athletic abilities and sports programs.

"What has made Carla's time here so incredible is not just her competence in teaching and the subject matter she covers, but her ability to relate to the students across all grade levels," says Mrs. Lane. "She just gets it. She gets children. Her humbleness, sense of humor, compassion, fairness, and commitment to her faith are what matter to Carla. She doesn't sweat the small stuff. The children have always felt loved and validated in her classroom. She is the epitome of what an administrator would look for in a faculty member. We love her dearly and she will be greatly missed."

Carla speaks enthusiastically about the atmosphere which makes St. Ignatius unique, explaining that the parents, students, and faculty work together to advocate for the school. She says the teachers share a culture where they learn from each other. Instructors in the upper grades discuss academic readiness and what children need to know in the lower grades. She credits Principal Lane and the faculty for creating a cohesive group reaching beyond what is found in the text books. She praises the school's Advisory Council and Parent Club and the many programs and extra curricular opportunities available to the students.

Standing by her side, and regularly referred to as her "right arm," is third grade aide Sherry

Savarino. "She can complete my sentences," says Carla explaining how vital it has been over the years to have Sherry in the classroom.

"Third grade has never been boring," says Sherry. "Carla teaches not only the academics, but how to sew on a button, act on stage, and learn to give to others by packing bags for the Sharing God's Bounty program. I will truly miss sitting at my desk across from her every day."

To ease the transition, Carla shared her classroom this past school year with incoming third grade teacher Katie Flores. Ms. Flores served as the science teacher for first, second, and third grades in 2009-10, before returning to the university setting to earn a Master's Degree in Education, among her many other credentials. Katie has joined the St. Ignatius staff as the full-time third grade teacher for the 2012-13 school year.

"I wish we could team teach many, many more years together because I truly learn something new from her each day," says Katie about Mrs. MacDonald.

Among the anecdotes that Carla shares is the fact that she taught some of the people who today are teachers and aides themselves at St. Ignatius, including sixth grade teacher Tessa Hatridge. She is reminded by second grade teacher Debbie Peters that they have taught together for all 26 years. She says that the best art show in town is put on by SI students with the help of art instructor Barbara Domek. She has enjoyed Father Tom's movie reviews, watching Vice Principal Katrena Hatridge's campus tours, and learning about all of the staff's children.

She smiles as she thinks about her students being so glad to go to PE. She says she will miss the little things like saying "adios" to the kids as they head off to Spanish, hearing the excitement of the children as they learn to keyboard, laughing in the lunch room with the staff, and planning the third grade plays.

Carla admits that it's more difficult to retire than she thought. "I'm not worried about filling my time," this grandmother of five says as quiet tears fall from her eyes. "I'm worried about missing the teachers, the parents, and the kids."

In honor of Carla's commitment to education, Father Mike Moynahan and Principal Patty Lane have established the "Carla MacDonald Scholarship Fund." Each year, a St. Ignatius student entering 8th grade will be selected for this honor based on criteria which reflect Mrs. MacDonald's impact on the St. Ignatius community. The recipient will receive a \$1,000 scholarship toward their school tuition based upon the virtues which embodied Carla, including living their Catholic faith daily, working to his or her potential, humbleness, a sense of humor, showing compassion, and making a difference by serving as "A Student For and With Others." All of you: our class, teachers, and parents have helped us grow in maturity, broaden our education, and deepen our spirituality."

Salutatorian Michaela Whitcomb-Weston noted that, "St. Ignatius has prepared me for high school by giving me the skills to succeed academically. I have also made amazing friends here."

HEALTHY IN MIND, BODY AND SPIRIT

Our SI Tigers love their sports! Whether dribbling a ball down a basketball court, serving it over the net, running it across the end zone, or hitting it on the green, our student athletes and their dedicated volunteer coaches love a great game, a great meet, and a great time!

Sports are an integral part of the total religious and educational program at St. Ignatius Parish School. The purpose of our sports program is to foster individual development through exercise, example, and athletic competition within a Christian atmosphere.

The 2011-12 sports season brought with it edge-of-your spectator seat excitement. Highlights include:

- Introducing our youngest athletes to SI Sports through our Little Dribblers program, where eight boys' and girls' teams had a dazzling time out on the basketball court.
- Boys' Varsity Football Team advanced to the semi-finals for the PAL (Parochial Athletic League) Championships taking second place.
- Junior Varsity Boys' Cross Country Team placed third overall for the season.
- Varsity Girls' Volleyball Team won the PAL City Championship with an action packed win over Holy Spirit.
- Varsity Boys' Competitive Basketball Team captured the PAL Basketball Championship. They also won the Jesuit Junior Classic in thrilling overtime play.
- Varsity Girls' Competitive Basketball Team took the ball all the way to the final match-up at the 2012 PAL Championship winning second place.
- Junior Varsity Girls' Competitive Basketball Team brought home first place trophies from both the St. Philomene's and Presentation tournaments.
- SI Golf Team had its top finish ever in the PAL Team Championships, missing a first place finish by mere strokes.
- The Girls' Flag Football Team took their touchdowns to a first place finish as Division Champions.
- Both the Varsity and Junior Varsity Track Teams raced their way to qualify for the PAL Team Track Championships with several runners placing among the top six in their individual events against hundreds of athletes.

In addition to our outstanding extra-curricular sports program, St. Ignatius Parish School is fortunate to have a full-time Physical Education instructor. All students participate in PE several times each week, playing a host of games and activities ranging from soccer to dodge ball to kickball. Sportsmanship remains an important focus, as well as teamwork. Our older children complete the Presidential Athletic Assessment Program, performing such tasks as pull-ups, sit-ups and a one-mile run. Our very smallest students are encouraged to ride tricycles, climb on a play structure dedicated solely to those ages kindergarten and younger, jump rope and just plain have fun!



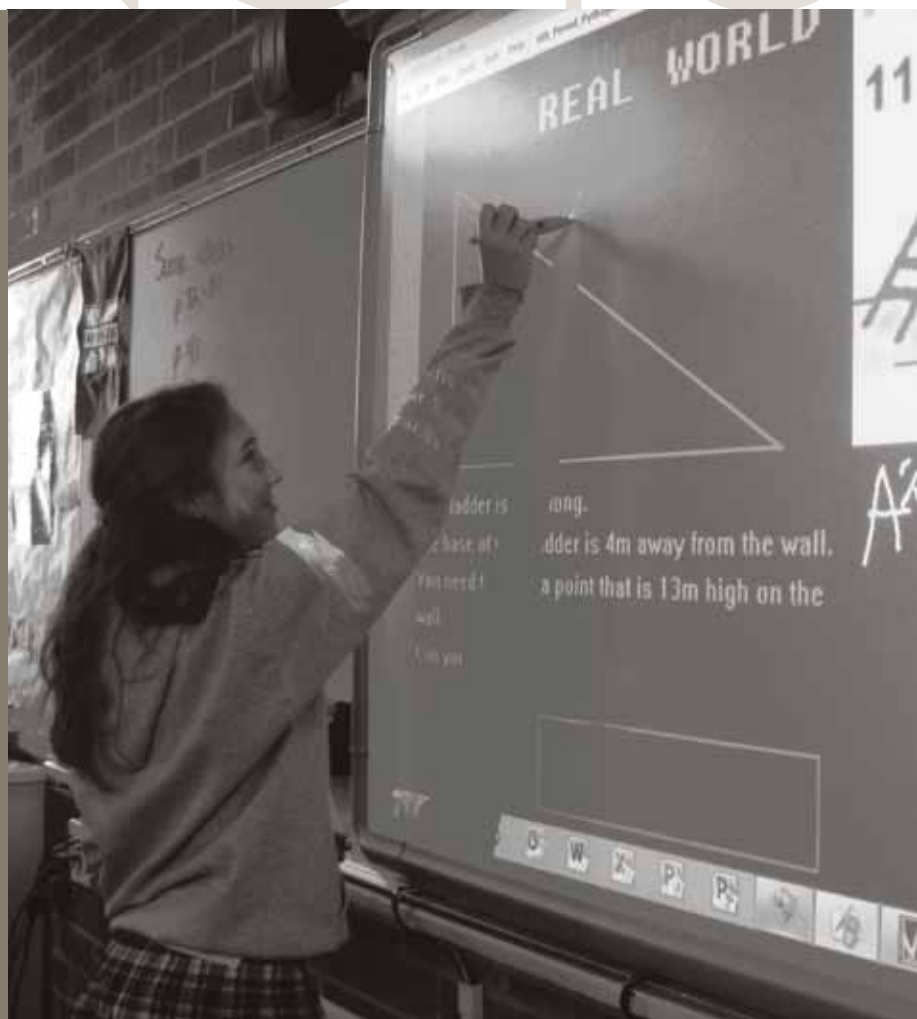


GIVING TO

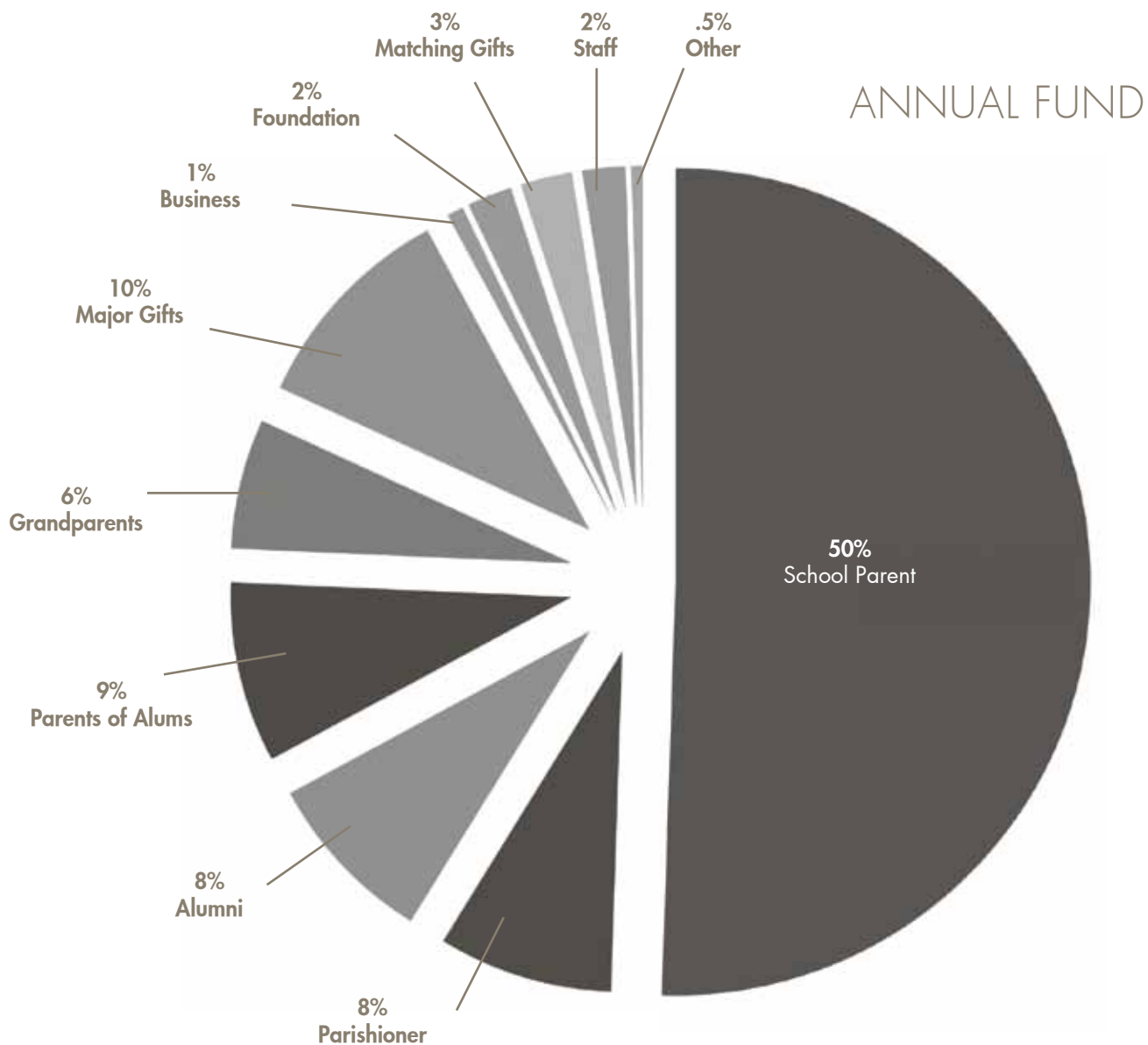

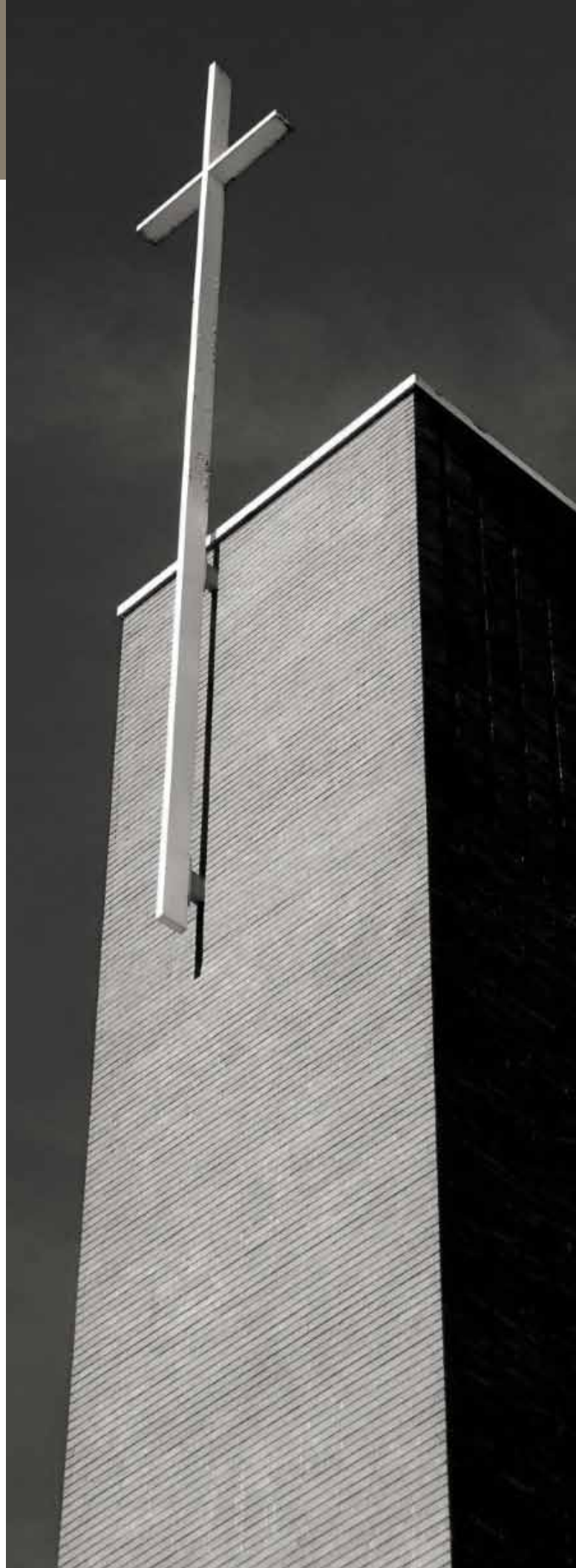
