Art Grading and Discipline Policy

All art assignments will have a maximum value of 10 points each. Occasional tests will also have a point value. Extra credit may be earned through additional projects and reports. At the end of each grading period the points will be tallied for a final letter grade. Since each student has a unique and personal artistic style, assignments will not be graded according to whether one students work looks "better" than another. Points will be determined according to the following criteria:

Citizenship grades will be determined according to the classroom Code of Conduct (attached page). In the event a student disrupts the class with inappropriate behavior, one or more of the following disciplinary actions will be taken:

In extreme cases, a trip to the office may be in order and parents may be contacted to discuss the offending behavior.
