Technology education begins as early as TK with topics such as coding, media literacy, collaboration, animation and video projects.


I am grateful to be part of this magical moment. The 2017-18 school-year provided many gifts and I count this journey as one of my life's blessings.

Our school community is blessed to include four Jesuit priests. Each class is assigned a priest who visits the classrooms regularly to support the religious education of the students. In addition to receiving instruction from our outstanding faculty, our students benefit from the experience of these world class educators who have taught from the high school to the college graduate level.

In first grade, we start with a strong foundation in science. First and second grades took a trip to the Farm at Cal Expo and the third grade went to the Powerhouse Science Center. Fourth grade, to prepare for upper science, did a lot of field work by examining different varieties of trees in Arden Park, going to the Roseville Utility Exploration Center, visiting the Sacramento Valley Medical Museum and the Nimbus Fish Hatchery.

In addition to our academic focus, we incorporate the mind, body and soul connection through our physical education program. We have been

blessed for the past 21 years to have Rich Romo teach students in P.E. about health, nutrition, exercise, sportsmanship and teamwork. Mr. Romo is able to sneak in a lot of learning about Faith, Action, and Integrity all while having a lot of fun with games.

The Arrupe Project is named for former Superior General of the Jesuits, Pedro Arrupe who said that "our prime educational objective must be to form men and women for others."






