



This year marks both an ending and anticipation for a new beginning for our St. Ignatius Parish School students. The 2019/20 school year will begin in a brand new school. While the place where your sons and daughters will be educated will change, what they are being taught hasn't. They are part of one of the nine (9) Jesuit elementary schools in the Jesuit West Province.

The Jesuit education that they will receive seeks to develop the whole student—intellectually, morally, and spiritually. Some of the values they will learn are social and environmental justice, interreligious understanding and service to others, especially the poor and socially marginalized.

Our students practiced their Catholic faith in all they did. Students were given many opportunities to bring the Gospel teachings to our community; classes led school Masses, students acted as altar servers and lectors at weekend Masses throughout the year, as well as performed many hours of community service. They were also guided by a class assigned priest who regularly visited and supported the religious growth of students.

Our Magis Club consisted of 60 third through eighth graders that met during lunch and after school to make blankets for Project Linus, sang Christmas carols at Shriners Hospital, made thank you cards for firefighters, police officers, and teachers, as well as get-well cards for children in hospitals.

Upper grade students provided love and support to the younger students by being partnered with their “buddies”. TKers were paired with a fifth grade student and that partnership will last until they graduate. Upper classmates and their buddies attended school masses together, spent class time working on projects, and went on various field trips. This bond lasts beyond elementary school.



In Lower Science, the first grade learned about plants at The California State Fair Farm, second grade explored the Biological Sciences department at Sac State, third grade reached for the stars at the The Powerhouse Planetarium, and fourth grade went to a local park to identify trees.

Our individual classes also had special experiences to encourage growth and knowledge. The third grade class spent the day living as a pioneer student at the Rhoad’s School built in 1872. In fourth grade the Gold Rush lesson was a living history field trip campout overnight in Coloma. Fifth grade spent the day at the Exploratorium in San Francisco bringing many science concepts to life. Sixth grade went to Sly Park for the week for team building, outdoor adventures, and many opportunities for personal growth. Seventh grade spent three days at the Marin Headlands on the coast for hands-on science and learning experiences. Finally, eighth grade students attended two retreats which helped them to further their relationship with God, their classmates, and themselves.



***St. Ignatius Parish School triumphed at the California State Academic Junior High Decathlon. The 2019 State Champions bested close to 700 Catholic schools from California, Nevada and Colorado.***

**This was the 12th year in a row St. Ignatius Parish School has triumphed at the local competition earning the right to represent the Diocese of Sacramento at the state competition.**

On Saturday April 6, the SI Acadeca Team competed against the ten California Catholic schools that had each prevailed at their Diocese Academic Decathlon competitions at St. Pius School in Redwood City.

The St. Ignatius Academic Decathlon team represents a broad spectrum of the school's student body. In addition to their full school academic schedule, they are student council members, members on numerous school and club athletic teams, play piano, altar serve, and are highly involved with various service organizations. These students were able to balance their time studying on weekends, during their lunch recess, in the evenings, and on holidays. Their coaches and parents rearranged their own schedules to be available to support them along the way.




