## The Ignatian Year

**In 1521, a young man's near death experience changed the course of history.**

A cannonball glanced the leg of 22-year-old Iñigo de Loyola ending his career as a soldier. As Loyola went through painful surgeries and a long recuperation, he also experienced a total conversion of heart and soul from which the Jesuit order was eventually formed.

In 2021, the Jesuit community celebrated the 500th anniversary of Ignatius' "cannonball moment" and conversion, dubbing it

"The Ignatian Year." The celebration began on May 20, 2021, continued through March 12, 2022 on the 400th anniversary of the canonization of Ignatius, and ended on July 31, 2022 with the Feast of St. Ignatius.

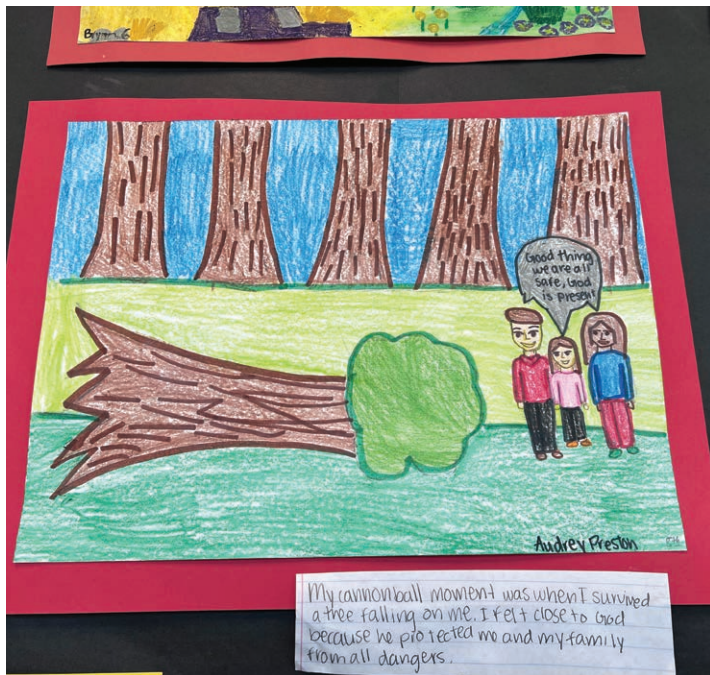

## S.I. is “Highly Effective”

During the 2021-22 school year, St. Ignatius Parish School completed the self-study process for Catholic Elementary Schools using the protocol found in the document for “Improving Student Learning” for the Western Catholic Educational Association (WCEA) and Western Accreditation Commission for Schools (WASC). The accreditation process is a periodic cycle of assessment, planning, implementing, monitoring, and reassessment; schools are typically visited every six years.

8. The creation of the Director of Ignatian Formation position and the implementation of the Ignatian Virtue program are benefits to the school.

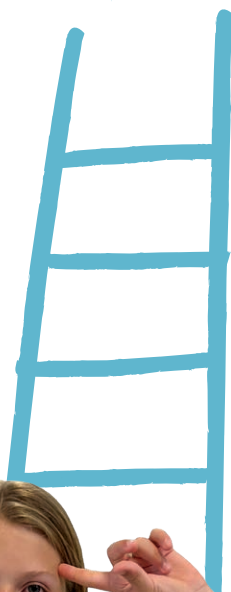

### Teaching Excellence

At St. Ignatius we are fortunate to employ faculty and staff who not only hold credentials, but more than half have earned their master's degree in education. We have dedicated teachers in science (two), art, Spanish, P.E., technology, resource support and advanced math—a rarity in schools in the Sacramento region. We also are one of the few schools that employ teachers in preschool, TK and kindergarten. We have full-time aides for all homeroom teachers and upper-level science.

The results of this commitment to teaching excellence can be seen in the success of our students. One hundred percent of our 8th grade students were accepted into the high school of their choice. Plus, our standardized test scores of our students continues to be above the Diocesan average.

### March Madness Acadeca Style

On March 5, 2022 the Diocese of Sacramento hosted the annual Academic Decathlon competition at Christian Brothers High School. With 19 teams participating, St. Ignatius School Academic Decathlon Team won the Diocesan competition for the 15th straight year! Then, on March 26, the team went onto the State/National Competition (virtual) where they placed second in the nation!

- Sacramento Children's Home

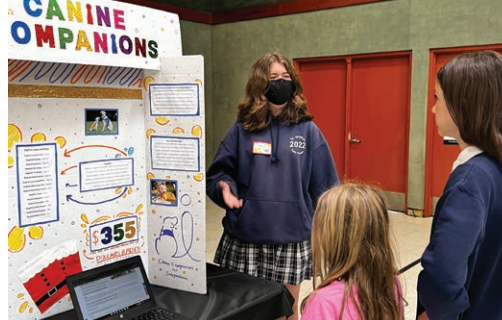


## Cristo Rey High School Adopt A Family Christmas Program

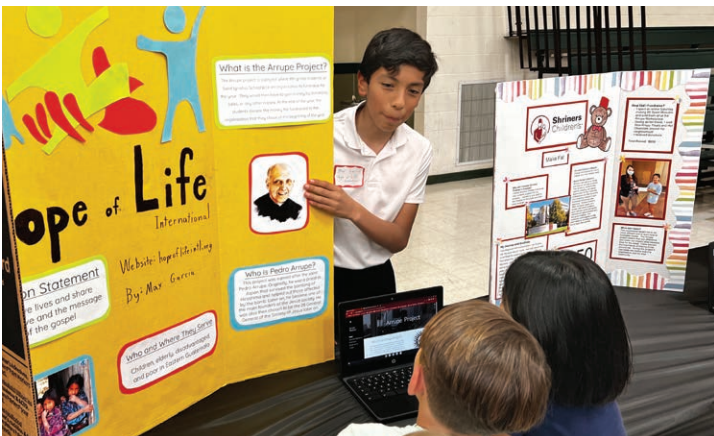

- Total removal of the existing lawn
- Full grading, tilling, and improving the underlying soil
- Installation of a brand new, water-efficient sprinkler system
- Installation of park quality large sheet sod

The 2021-2022 athletic season saw 254 student athletes participating on 25 teams.

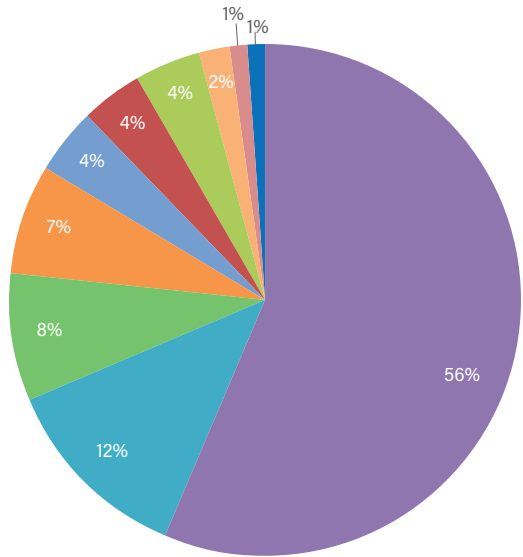

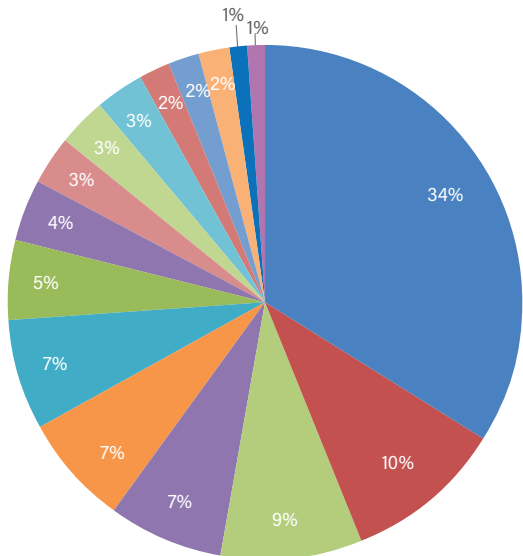
