Begin each day with a short prayer of gratitude.


Write a love letter.

It was preschool graduation and the very last student was about to walk across the stage, in a very smart-looking suit, as cute as could be. Instead of reaching out his hand to shake mine (as some kids in the past have done), he gained a bit of momentum and jumped into my arms and gave me the best hug. Wow! A Holy Moment for sure, one I will remember for the rest of my life. This little guy

had no idea how difficult the night before had been with a family member fighting cancer. How much I missed my family back east, how busy things were at work, and me just feeling a bit overwhelmed that day. This 4-year-old little man had no clue what his hug meant to me and how much lighter my step was the rest of the day and, really, the rest of the year because of him. It is many months later and I can still feel that hug.

Holy Moments can provide us with lessons, energy, hope, peace and so much more. I think one of the most important lines in the book is that "the Messiah is among you." He is here with us every day. As a community, we have also leaned on each other this past year, in challenging and joyful times. As a Jesuit school, our entire community is actionoriented based on service. Because of this, Holy Moments are abundant. I hope you realize how many Holy Moments you were a part of this year as you read this annual report and how much your presence and participation made a difference.

We are happy to provide you with this annual report that chronicles the past year at St. Ignatius Parish School. As we prepare to enter our seventh decade as a parish and school, we want to acknowledge the past, celebrate our present, and live into the future full of hope and energy.

We have received so many blessings. We celebrate our rich heritage of Jesuit education coupled with the long vision of our founders and our "barn families" who, in the early 1950s, envisioned a church and school on an empty lot here on Arden Way.

We celebrate the long years of growth, the generations of children we ve educated and the families served in our parish faith community.

We rejoice now that we have a beautiful new school that is expertly staffed, safe and designed for 21st century pedagogy, as well as a recently renewed playing field and gymnasium that serve their recreational and sporting needs.

This year we are happy to announce that through the hard work of the parish and school staff and the great generosity of our benefactors, we have embarked on a second phase of our capital campaign entitled, Our Future, Our Faith, Our Time. In doing so, we are continuing to pay down our remaining

construction debt for the new school and parish offices. When our most recent pledges are fully paid, we will have eliminated more than 85 percent (\$10.2 million) of our overall \$12.2 million project costs. Our school and parish remain committed to contribute each year to the paydown as well.

This new campaign needs support from both our parish and school communities, and I am confident that it will be successful. We are committed to this fundraising goal because we need to be free from debt in order to truly thrive. Once our debt obligation has been fulfilled, we will again be able to engage in new projects, initiatives, and hiring for our students' and parishioners' benefit.

I express my gratitude to those who have already made or will make commitments to our campaign as it enters its public phase, as well as for your continuing support for our school through our Annual Fund, Auction, and other activities.



• 4th graders traveled back in time at the Effie Yeaw Nature Center, where they learned about how the Nisenan Maidu people lived in harmony with their environment.

- 7th grade students participated in the Nature Bridge program at the Marin Headlands.This experience enabled students to build meaningful relationships and discover a caring relationship with the natural world.
- 2nd graders researched an animal and then presented information to their families.



Rooted in our Jesuit tradition, St. Ignatius Parish school is committed to ensuring our students become young men and women for others. What this means is that we have a fervent commitment to doing justice. Holy Moments that promote justice can manifest themselves in many different ways. They can be standing up to a bully, inviting someone who is by themselves to play or sit with you at lunch, helping the less fortunate, or doing your part to promote the good you see in others.

Here are some examples of how our school community demonstrated their commitment to doing justice during the 2022-23 academic year:

- 8th grade class, "Promoters of Peace," raised more than \$20,000 for 33 nonprofit organizations as part of their Arrupe Projects. These annual service projects, named after the influential Jesuit, Fr. Pedro Arrupe, aim to empower our 8th grade students to become men and women for others through faith, service, and justice. Through these projects, students "pay it forward" by becoming engaged in responding to social injustice in addition to raising awareness about and funds for various nonprofit organizations throughout our region, nation and world.
- S.I. alumna Hannah Stouder '21 created "Hannah's Care Closet." This drive provides hygiene items to help unhoused students and families in the Oak Park area.





• The S.I. community collected thousands of nonperishable food items to help fill the shelves of food banks in our area, offered weekly meals to those suffering from food insecurity, and sponsored numerous families during the holidays providing clothing, toys and household items to the less fortunate.


Grandparents CLUB




