### Chapter 21:

### God Made Butterflies

In this lesson the children talked about surprises God put in our world-in particular, lovely butterflies that come from caterpillars. This prepares the children for the dramatic change we make at death when we enter into new eternal life. Have your child talk about the surprises pictured on page 91 and tell you the story of a butterfly's life. Display the picture your child made.

### Your Child

The life cycle of a butterfly and the death of a seed that is born again as a flower are symbols and promises of our new life. As Jesus rose from the dead, so will we. This mystery is beyond the scope of our understanding. Answer your child's questions about death simply and honestly. Because of Jesus' Resurrection, we can rejoice in this life in preparation for the next.

- · Point out natural wonders, such as rainbows,
- Take your child to a natural history museum. Convey wonder over the world's marvels,
- Take a nature walk with your child and admire God's gifts.
- Plant seeds with your child and watch them grow.
- Read to your child The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle. Consider the wonder of the caterpillar's transformation into a butterfly. Thank God for all the surprises in the world.
